- 1. I extend a warm welcome to you all back to the office in this New Year. I hope you have all taken time to rest over the holiday season and have returned re- energized to take on the New Year's challenges.
- 2. This year marks the beginning of the last five years period to the year 2030. As a government, we have committed ourselves to transform our country into a united, prosperous, and developed nation under vision 2030.
- 3. The journey towards 2030 has been full of challenges, and although we have put up commendable efforts towards achieving Vision 2030 goals that we had to overcome several challenges has slowed down the progress towards our agreed targets.
 - 3.1 The past five years have seen the escalation of these challenges, with the onset of COVID and recurrent weather related emergencies which eroded many of the gains that we had made as a country.
