- By the 28th of March 2022, a total number of 33675 people received their 1st dose of the COVID-19 vaccine, representing 34% of the target population while 30744 people are fully vaccinated representing 32% of the target population.
- \* The region conducted Integrated Maternal and Child Health Care Week campaign 07-11 February focusing on routine immunization missed opportunities and COVID-19 vaccination with the support from WHO.(total of 1917 people were vaccinated with COVID-19 vaccine during the campaign)
